The San Francisco Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART) District is planning for the extension of the BART line to a new station within the I-580 median at Isabel Avenue.






# **BART to Livermore Extension (cont.)**


- Draft EIR released July 2017
- Includes three modal alternatives
  - 1) Diesel Multiple Unit/Electric Multiple Unit
  - 2) Enhanced Bus Service
  - 3) Express Bus Service
- Comment period closed October 16, 2017
- The Isabel Neighborhood Plan will guide land use development surrounding the proposed BART station.




#### **Proposed Land Use Plan**




#### **General Plan Policies**


- Objective LU-1.1 Locate new development so as to create a consolidated pattern of urbanization, maximizing the use of existing public services and facilities.
- Objective LU-1.2 Create neighborhoods that include a mix of uses and a range of housing types to meet the needs of all residents.
- Goal LU-3 Provide areas for high-density mixed-use development near transit.
- Goal CIR-8: Ensure a well-coordinated regional transportation system that serves Livermore and the surrounding region.
- Goal ED-2: Balance the supply of job and housing opportunities in Livermore, and match jobs and wages to housing prices.




## **Proposed Roadway Network**






#### **Proposed Trail Network**




