- Stakeholder Intent
  - •Expand and Improve on Existing Services and Supports Already Provided at the Site
  - Provide Deeply Affordable Housing
  - •Effective Collaboration and Response to Homelessness in Livermore
  - Serve the Neighborhood
  - •Serve Livermore and Tri Valley First
  - •Stay Focused on Solutions



- •24 homes for the homeless
  - •18 studios
  - •5 one bedroom
  - •1 two bedroom (resident manager)
- •Community room and other amenities for residents

- Open Heart Kitchen
  - •"No One Goes Hungry in Livermore"
  - Modern Commercial Kitchen serving meals7 days/week
  - •Dining Room will accommodate over 100 diners at a time

- Development Timeline
  - •August 2018: Submit Planning Application
  - September 2018: Close of Escrow
  - •December 2018: Receive Entitlements
  - •June 2019-2020: Construction Period
  - •July 2020: Occupancy and Operations



#### Vineyard 2.0

- •Total Project Cost estimated at \$17 million
- •Funding:
  - City of Livermore
  - •Cities of Pleasanton and Dublin
  - •Individual and Institutional Donors
  - •Exploring:
    - •Alameda County Measure A1
    - •No Place Like Home
    - Veterans Affairs
    - Other Public Sources



- Public funds are available for the residential portion
- •Funding gap exists for construction of kitchen and homeless resource center
- Additional Funding (estimated at \$75-\$100k) needed for the client-based amenities:
  - Laundry machines
  - Mailboxes
  - •Furniture, including community room and dining room
  - •Bike Racks, Dog Run
